WORKSHOP SUMMARY:

This is a LEVEL 2 workshop. You must complete Level 1 before taking Level 2. This two-day workshop (conducted from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m. both days) will focus on the behavioral components of serious incidents in the workplace. You will learn how to prepare for an investigation by gaining the skills to understand emotion, control cognitive bias, manage conflict, understand memory, and more. We will discuss real world scenarios from the field and best practices in maintaining professional as well as objective investigations. Goals will emphasize:

- Personality styles
- Preventing cognitive bias
- Role of emotion in incidents
- Maintaining professionalism
- How memory works
- Behavioral documentation
- Managing conflict
- Making the subjective more objective

Workshop content will work to support the DHS. Includes latest forms and processes.

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NOTE: **Attendees must complete LEVEL 1 before taking LEVEL 2.**

(If you took the NJACP Ensuring an Effective Investigation of Serious Incidents workshop before January 1, 2018, then you need to take LEVEL 1. The information covered in the previous one level workshop program focused more on material covered in Level 2. Level 1 will have new information.)
